

Bromley Adult Education College Acceptable Internet Use 2022-2023 Learner Agreement

BAEC Acceptable Internet Use Policy has been drawn up to protect staff, students and general users.

The following activities are not permitted:

- Sending or displaying offensive messages or pictures
- Posting anonymous messages and forwarding chain messages
- Accessing inappropriate material
- Violating copyright laws (e.g. downloading or copying media in breach of BAEC educational license*)
- Trespassing in another's folder, work or files
- Intentionally wasting limited resources
- Using the Internet for personal financial gain, gambling or advertising
- Using racist, sexist, homophobic, violent or abusive language during the conduct of emails or other online activities
- Using bullying or discriminatory tactics against staff or other students
- Knowingly introducing a virus onto a BAEC system or compromising the integrity of a BAEC system in any way
- Downloading and installing software (including games and utilities)

Users should abide by the following rules

- Use social media responsibly (e.g. only contact tutors or students during working hours, respect others' confidentiality and privacy etc.)
- Respect the acceptable use policies of any network that they access
- Receive regular training on Digital Safety (provided by BAEC)
- Check the length of articles/media files and only print essential resource materials
- Log out of personal accounts on computers at the end of each session, as BAEC cannot be held responsible for personal data breaches caused by users themselves
- BAEC reserves the right to examine or delete any files stored on its computer systems and monitor use of the Internet.
